LOCATION ~ The 22<sup>nd</sup> Annual Finger Lakes International Wine & Spirits Competition (FLIWC) was held June 21-23 and June 27, 2022. All proceeds from the competition benefit the children and families affected by cancer and sickle cell anemia served by Camp Good Days & Special Times.

Started 22 years ago, The Finger Lakes International Wine & Spirits Competition has become one of the largest wine competitions in the world to benefit a charitable organization.

A few of the significant changes made to the competition over the last few years have remained in place to make sure that the health and safety of all involved is at the forefront due to COVID-19. Over 1,850 wines and spirits were entered and then blind judged by a distinguished group of judges composed of sommeliers, wine makers, wine writers, experienced spirits judges, as well as wine educators. They awarded bronze, silver and gold medals, and where it was unanimous, double gold. This year, a *platinum* medal is awarded to the wine that holds extraordinary distinction during the "Best in Class" evaluation.

All wines and spirits were presented blindly to the panel of judges with only the varietal or blend identified. No indication of geography, vintage, or price point is shared, ensuring total unbiased evaluation given to each wine and spirit.

MORE ABOUT CAMP GOOD DAYS AND SPECIAL TIMES:

Camp Good Days and Special Times, a 501(c)3 not-for-profit organization dedicated to improving the quality of life for children, adults, and families whose lives have been touched by cancer and sickle cell anemia, was founded by Gary Mervis in 1979, following the diagnosis of his youngest daughter, Teddi, with a malignant brain tumor. What was started to provide Teddi and 62 other children with cancer (21 from Rochester, 21 from Buffalo, 21 from Syracuse) with a residential camping experience has grown to become one of the largest organizations of its kind, having served as model for other organizations and cancer treatment centers around the world. Providing residential camping programs and year-round recreational and support activities and events, Camp Good Days has served more than 50,000 campers from 22 states and 36 foreign countries.
